

# Back Woods Prim Pillow



Making a decorative "prim" pillow for the door or tree is easy using things you have on hand at home, or easy to find things from common stores. This project is made from a scrap of flannel and a matching homespun fat quarter. With a few decorative buttons and a wire.

Embroider your design on fabric for top, and use matching fabric to make the pillow. Cut your embroidered fabric top to be about 3.5x6 inches. And your coordinating pillow back fabric to about 6x18 inches. ANY size you want it is fine. Once you have the flannel cut, I used a straight pin and frayed the edges for that prim look.



Fold the pillow fabric in half on the long side. Sew the sides and the end leaving a small opening to turn and stuff. Stuff it to the size you want. More for the tree or less for the door.



Whipstitch the opening closed, and then pin the embroidered piece on the front. Now, using a long stitch and pear cotton stitch the front to the pillow. Tie a bit of a bow and add some decorative buttons. For the wire, I used a pencil to put some curls in it, then poked it through the corners of the pillow and wrapped the ends.
