

Back Up Cd Pouch



When Carol came up with the idea that we needed to encourage everyone to back up their designs more often, I thought this would be a fun project for storing your designs

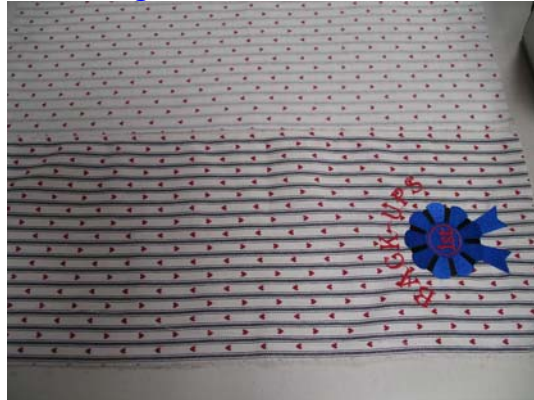
I created this larger than a CD so that you can add several together. I have tried this out and have gotten as many as 35 in this pouch in their paper sleeves.

Materials needed:

Fabric: 1 fat quarter

Fusible Batting: 8x17

Cut 2 pieces of fabric 8 x 17 inches, and embroider the design you have chosen on the upper 1/3 of the fabric on one piece. Remember that you need to face your design to the edge so that when you fold it over it will be facing the correct direction.



Iron both the front and the back of the fabric. Add the fusible no show fleece to the backside of the piece that is embroidered and press from the fabric side. Then lay the right sides of the fabric together and sew all around leaving a small opening for turning.



Turn your project right side out and press. Be sure to press that opening together and use a bit of steam a seam or a pin to hold it. Now take it to the machine and do a top stitch all around.



Add a button loop to the design end. You can also use snaps or Velcro.



Fold your pocket up just over 1/3 of the way. Pin and then sew matching seams to your top stitch on both sides to make the pocket for the cd.



Add a decorative button and you are all done! Now that was fun, fast and easy...wasn't it!

This same style of pouch can be used to store other things as well, anything from your GPS, to MP3 and any of the other alphabet things. Makeup, tissues, lady things and more work well also.
