

Oven door Towel And Holder



Making a decorative towel hanger for the oven door is easy using things you have on hand at home, or easy to find things from common stores. This project is made from a kitchen towel and matching fabric, but can also be done with a nice towel and matching pot holder as shown in the photo below.

Embroider your design on fabric for top, and use matching fabric to appliqué towel design. Cut your fabric top to be about 8.5 inches wide and with this design it needs to be about 12 inches long. Cut a matching back of fabric as well.



Use Floriani Heat N Sta fusible fleece and press the fusible side to the back of the design area. Add right sides of fabric together, add a loop of ribbon on the short end opposite the design.



Sew with about a .25 inch seam allowance, leaving a small opening to turn. Turn right side out, using steam a seam press opening closed and topstitch around.



Fold towel to match the size of the topper. I used an accordion fold on sides. Put right side of towel up, and right side of topper down, marking center of each. Make a zig zag seam right down the center of the towel and topper connecting them. Add a decorative button to the front and tie to stove door.
